DIVISION OF CAPITOL POLICE WILL PROMOTE AND HONOR FOUR OFFICERS AT THE VIRGINIA STATE CAPITOL ~ Formal Promotion Ceremony Planned for Tuesday ~

RICHMOND, VA – On Tuesday, November 30, Virginia’s Division of Capitol Police will promote four Capitol Police Officers at a 2:00 p.m. ceremony in the Old House Chambers in the Virginia State Capitol. These promotions are a continuation of a new promotional system and agency restructuring implemented by Colonel Kimberly S. Lettner, Chief of the Division of Capitol Police.

Thomas Hickey, formerly Sergeant, Investigations, **has been named Lieutenant, Special Operations.** Hickey has over 29 years of law enforcement experience with DCP. His new duties consist of managing the day-to-day operations of Investigations, administrative oversight and coordination of the Critical Incident Team and the Crowd Response Teams, development of the Division’s operations plans for special events, and intelligence. He holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Edinboro, University of Pennsylvania and is a graduate of the Virginia Forensic Science Academy. Originally from Warren, PA, currently resides in Henrico County, Virginia.

Jesse Gilliam, formerly Patrolman, **has been named Shift Sergeant, Day Shift.** Gilliam has 15 years of law enforcement experience. His new duties involve supervising patrolmen assigned and daily operations of the day shift. He retired from the U.S. Navy as a Helicopter Aircrewman and Undersea Acoustic Analyst.
