## **Capitol Police Investigate Suspicious Substance**

RICHMOND, VA — On Wednesday, April 6, 2016, at approximately 2:45 pm, the Capitol Police responded to a report of a suspicious substance at the Virginia Supreme Court Building at 100 N. 9<sup>th</sup> Street. A preliminary investigation revealed that when a piece of mail was opened in the Clerk's Office on the 5<sup>th</sup> floor of the building, a white powder spilled out. The area was isolated by Capitol Police and the remainder of the 5<sup>th</sup> floor was evacuated. Richmond Fire Department and HAZMAT responded and collected a sample of the substance for testing. The sample was transported to the State Lab at 600 N. 5<sup>th</sup> Street, where it tested negative for hazardous material. The criminal investigation into the source of the envelope and a possible motive is on-going, with the assistance of the U.S. Postal Inspection Service. The person responsible could be charged with Virginia Code Section 18.2-46.6(C), "Possession, manufacture, distribution, etc. of weapon of terrorism or hoax device", which is a Class 6 Felony punishable by up to 12 months in jail and/or a \$2500 fine.
