PRINCE GEORGE – The Virginia Division of Capitol Police grew by three officers Friday morning with their graduation from the 104th Basic Law Enforcement Academy of the Crater Criminal Justice Training Academy.

The ceremony held at Crater Criminal Justice Training Academy in Prince George, honored the 25-member class, including new Capitol Police officers Bryson Long of Chesterfield, Erykah Rasheem-I of Henrico and Cristopher Sosa of Henrico.

The members of the 104th Basic Law Enforcement Academy represented 14 agencies and spent approximately six months training at the academy covering more than 1,300 Virginia Department of Criminal Services-mandated training objectives.
