Seven Capitol Police Officers Graduate From Academy

DISPUTANTA, VA -- Seven new Division of Capitol Police officers graduated Thursday night, Sept. 7, from the 89th Basic Law Enforcement Academy at the Crater Criminal Justice Training Academy.

The officers covered 1,300 Department of Criminal Justice Services-mandated training objectives during the 26-week academy in Prince George County. Upon returning to Richmond, the seven officers will undergo extensive field training with Division-certified Field Training Officers before being assigned to their respective shifts.

"Law enforcement is a rapidly changing and challenging profession, and I applaud our new officers for making a selfless choice to serve others with honor," said Col. Anthony S. Pike, Chief of the Division of Capitol Police. "We look forward to them helping us provide progressive law enforcement and security services to the Commonwealth of Virginia."

Sandoval was third in driving and was the class chaplain, and David O. Nash was third in firearms.
